## Community Grants & Sponsorship Awards

## Neighbourhood Plan

The Horforth Neighbourhood Plan (NP) is taking shape with input to Horforth Town Council Planning Committee from the working group that meets monthly before the scheduled Planning meeting. The working group has broken down the NP into key headings for which statements will be made in the plan. In no particular order these are: - housing, infrastructure, services, leisure, youth, education, design, conservation, environment, elderly / retirement, shopping and employment. There is already a lot of action centrally on housing with Leeds City Council, as the Core Strategy 2013 -2028 target of 70,000 dwellings is currently under review by HMI Planning Inspectorate. A statement from Horforth Town Council on the progress of the Neighbourhood Plan was recently provided to the Inspector hearing the Curwood Lane appeal by Redrow Homes to build 31 houses. This highlighted the 1,250 Horforth Town Council survey responses to possible site allocations in Horforth, which identified Outwood Lane as a suitable site for development. Please contact Horforth Town Council if you are interested in becoming involved in formulating the NP.

## Young Achievers and Good Citizens Awards. Is there someone you think should be recognised for their personal or community achievements?

**The Young Achiever Award is open to any young person, aged 9 to 17.**

**The Good Citizen Award is open to those aged 18 or more.**

The nominees must be residents of Horforth, and must be nominated by a minimum of 2 people, in writing, sent to the Clerk of Horforth Town Council.

Nominations should demonstrate any significant personal achievements or contributions made by the individuals to Horforth, or any other communities. There is no restriction within these criteria.

All nominations will be considered by Horforth Town Council Community & Environment Committee.
