HAVE YOUR SAY! Horsforth Neighbourhood Plan

Horsforth Town Council has been working since 2012 on a neighbourhood plan (NP) for Horsforth. If adopted, the NP will strengthen our community's influence on local planning, protection of green spaces and future development as it means Leeds City Council (LCC) must consider it when deciding on planning applications.

At the end of 2019 the NP was finalised and submitted to LCC and an independent examiner to check it was legally compliant. The next step is adoption by LCC and planning law



requires that there is a local referendum on the NP for the people who the plan might affect.

The date set for the Horsforth NP Referendum will be Thursday 27 February 2020.

All those within the Horsforth Town Council area and on the Horsforth Electoral Roll will be notified of the referendum and directed to the final Horsforth NP and its supporting documents. All the details can be found on the Town Council's website.

The referendum will ask the question: -

"Do you want Leeds City Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Horsforth to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?"

A majority 'yes' decision will give Horsforth residents more say in the local planning process.

New speed limits

One of the biggest changes around Horsforth in the past few months, which I hope you have noticed, is the change in speed limits on most residential roads (not just around schools) from 30mph to 20mph.

Please adhere to this reduced speed and help contribute to making Horsforth roads that bit safer.

Neighbourhood Plan and 3 & 5 The Green

The two major projects that the Council is involved in, the Neighbourhood Plan and the purchase of 3 & 5 The Green, are progressing and reaching crucial stages.

As seen elsewhere in this issue, the City Council has accepted the Neighbourhood Plan, which will give Horsforth more say over developments in the town and increased revenue from the levy paid by developers, and it will soon be going to a referendum where you will have the opportunity to say whether you agree to the implementation of the plan.

The purchase of 3 & 5 The Green is also progressing slowly. The loan application has been approved and we are just waiting for the City Council to approve the sale and to reach agreement with them on the lease conditions.

Complaints

Probably one of the most common complaints we get is on parking around schools at drop-off and pick-up times.

Can I ask all residents that drive to school to drop-off and pick-up their children to remember to park considerately and especially not to block access to residents' drives.

Representing Horsforth

One of the pleasures of being a town councillor and especially of being the Chair is to be able to represent Horsforth at various events.

One such event that I attended along with Cllrs Calvert and Stones, was the Pool-in-Wharefdale Civic Service which was hosted at St Wilfreds Church by the Chair of Pool Parish Council, Hazel Lee, (see picture).

I was also pleased to represent the Town at the Candlelit Christmas Service at St James' Church and to give the first reading of the service.

Chair's Charity

Other local town councils have one or two charities chosen by the Town Mayor that they fundraise for during the year.

Horsforth does not have a Mayor, but at a recent Council meeting I suggested that we instigate a Chair's Charity which was agreed by Councillors.

Then came the question "Do you have anything in mind?" and this is where you come in. Do you know of any local good cause - it doesn't have to be a registered charity, it might just be a community group - that we could collect for at events such as the Christmas Lights switch-on. Horsforth Town Council Declares Climate Emergency



At its meeting on 31 July 2019, Horsforth Town Council unanimously voted to declare a climate emergency and pledged to do everything within its power to make Horsforth carbon neutral by 2030.

The Council has created a climate emergency working group which will aim to call on the UK government to provide the powers and resources to make the 2030 target possible.

The group will be calling a town meeting to engage with the community in Horsforth and with Leeds City Council on how to deliver this goal.

Councillor Simon Dowling, Vice-Chair of the Council, said "Everyone on the Council is committed to tackling the climate emergency and will be working hard for the Council to do what it can to reduce the impact in Horsforth."

Since the declaration the working group has met and Cllr Simon Dowling has been elected as the lead councillor for the working group. The working group has started looking at ways it can achieve the aims that were set out in the Council's motion.
