As we approach the end of the year, things really start picking up in the Town Council Calendar with lots of events coming up over the next few months in the run up to Christmas.

One of the big weekends of the year for the Town Council is in November as we come together as a community in Horsforth to remember our fallen heroes over Remembrance Weekend.

There are a couple of events which you can attend and the details of both events are in this edition of Horsforth Matters.

The first event is Friday, 10 November at 10.45am at Horsforth Cemetery where we are led by the Chaplain from Abbey Grange High School, Kay Brown, in a short Remembrance service and then students from Abbey Grange will lay small crosses at the graves of fallen heroes from Horsforth. I will also have the honour of laying a wreath on a grave of a fallen soldier on behalf of the Town Council. Our attentions will then turn to Remembrance on Sunday, 12 November. With the support of the Royal British Legion and Horsforth Churches Together we will parade from Morrisons on Broadgate Lane, down Stanhope Drive where we will stop at the Memorial Stone for a minute's silence and where I,

as Chair of Council, will lay a wreath on behalf of the Town Council. The parade will continue down Stanhope Drive along the Ring Road to the Horsforth Horse roundabout and then back along to the Cenotaph. We will then have a short Remembrance Service at the Cenotaph where we will pay our respects to our fallen heroes from Horsforth.

We then will welcome all guests of the Cenotaph Service to the Willows for tea, coffee and biscuits.

There are lots of people in Horsforth who are involved in these Remembrance events and I want to pay special tribute to the Royal British Legion for their ongoing support and commitment to remembering our fallen heroes here in Horsforth.

As we approach this time of year I will leave you with these words:

They shall grow not old, as we that are left grow old: Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn. We will remember them.

CHRISTMAS LIGHTS SWITCHON

SATURDAY, 2 DECEMBER 2023 ON THE GREEN AND TOWN STREET, HORSFORTH.

The Christmas Lights Switch-on event has been a Horsforth Town Council staple for many years, yet this year's event will be bigger than ever.

Last year, alongside the traditional Lights Switch-on event, there was a Christmas Market hosted by the Horsforth Town Team, a collective of local businesses. This year the two events will be combined into one. Imagine the Coronation event from earlier this year, only with Christmas decorations instead of Union Flags lining Town Street. The event will take place on Saturday, 2 December, from 12:00pm to 7:00pm. Town Street will be closed from the Kerry Hill junction to the Green, to allow the local businesses to set out their stalls. The stage will face up Town Street, and bands and artists will perform throughout. The Christmas lights themselves will be switched on from 5:00pm.

As Dementia Champion for Horsforth Town Council I have recently become involved with Dementia Friendly Horsforth (DFH), a group of local people dedicated to supporting people with dementia and their carers. DFH started out as a council working group but is now a voluntary association independent of the council.

It's been a busy few months for DFH. Back in April Dr Wendy Mitchell visited us for the second time to give a talk about her experience of living with early onset dementia. In May there was a series of events for the annual Dementia Action Week, including a dementia-themed film at the Grove and fundraising for the Alzheimer's Society, followed by the Horsforth Gala in June where DFH had a stall.

We are also supporting a new memory café taking place on the last Wednesday of every month at the sports club on King George's Field, Brownberrie Lane, where people with dementia and their carers can meet for conversation, activities and free refreshments. The first one took place in September and we had lots of positive feedback from it.

Annual play

In recent years DFH has staged an annual play on the theme of dementia. This year's play is The Purple List, a one-man performance centred on the partner of a man with dementia.

The performance is at 2.30pm on Saturday 28 October at St Margaret's Parish Centre.

We are also promoting an initiative to encourage businesses to be recognised as dementia-friendly. Business owners have the opportunity to attend a free half-hour information session, and will then get a dementia-friendly sticker to display which is recognised by the Alzheimer's Society. There are already a few shops in Horsforth that are displaying the sticker, and we are actively trying to encourage more to do the same.
